Whip cream cheese, but ter and vanilla with an electric mixer until fluffy, about 2 minutes. Beat in powdered sugar. Add more if necessary to reach desired consistency. Makes enough to top one $13 x 9$-inch cake. Double recipe if using on a layered cake.
