Steiner retired from the U.S. Navy after serving 22 years, including three tours in Vietnam.

"Corvette is my car and the one I have now, a C6 2007, was purchased in Arizona," he said.

He named the car Private Malone after a song performed by David Ball called, "Riding With Private Malone."

"I attend car shows in Detroit, Michigan; Le Claire, Iowa; and Effingham, Illinois, where veterans sign my car," Steiner said.

"On Aug. 10-13 I will be in Chamberlain, South Dakota, at a rest stop where the traveling Vietnam Veterans Wall will be. At the present time I have over 8,000 veterans who have signed my car."





This week I have a recipe for Preacher's Cake. This cake is super easy to make and comes out looking and tasting fabulous.

Preacher Cake got its name because it was a cake you usually had the ingredients for in

told you he was coming to visit, you could whip one up with what you had on hand. In those days women felt the need to make a cake when a visitor was coming. When I was growing up my mom always made a cake for Sunday in case company would come.

### Preacher's Cake

3 cups flour

2 teaspoons baking soda

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

2 cups sugar

3 eggs

1 cup vegetable oil

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1 20-ounce can crushed pineapple, with juice

1 1/2 cups finely chopped pecans or walnuts, divided

1 cup flaked coconut (optional) Sift together flour, baking soda, salt and cinnamon; set

Combine sugar, eggs, oil and vanilla and mix on medium-low speed with an electric mixer until creamy. Slowly mix in flour mixture until just combined.

Add pineapple (undrained),

1 cup chopped pecans and coconut and continue mixing on medium-low speed until all ingredients are thoroughly combined (about 1 minute).

Spray a 13x9-inch baking pan with cooking spray. Pour cake batter into pan and bake at 350 degrees for 45-50 minutes or until cake is set in the center and a toothpick inserted comes out clean.

Cool cake completely in pan, then frost with Cream Cheese Frosting. Sprinkle remaining 1 /2 cup chopped pecans over cake. Store in refrigerator.

### **Cream Cheese Frosting**

1 8-ounce package cream cheese, room temperature

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, room temperature

1 teaspoon vanilla

2 cups powdered sugar

Whip cream cheese, butter and vanilla with an electric mixer until fluffy, about 2 minutes. Beat in powdered sugar. Add more if necessary to reach desired consistency. Makes enough to top one 13x9-inch cake. Double recipe if using on a layered cake.
